What is your vision for your convention?

Canadian Content: we're not a "Canadian Worldcon" - we are a Worldcon that is hosted in Canada. We'll take advantage of our host to feature what Canada and Canadians have given to speculative fiction, art, and science. "Canadian Content" includes contributions to our genre interests of Canadians to our community. We'll also use Canadian vendors whenever feasible. And we'll use Canadian spellings for our Guests of Honour and our Programme!

Enhance and Extend the Legacy of Worldcon: as the 85th World Science Fiction Conventions, we need to both continue the great work of those who have come before us and those who will follow us. We not only want to make Montréal 2027 the best Worldcon yet, but we want to enable the 86th and 87th and 144th and all the future Worldcons to be even better. We're committed to both supporting our staff members with Worldcon experience and recruiting volunteers new to Worldcons to expand the pool of people available to staff future events. We're also committed to both serving the global fan community and reaching out to include readers, art lover, and others who have not yet discovered the joys of fandom.

Fun! We're in Montréal, the home of joie de vivre. Worldcon is a fun event, and Montréal is a fun city. We want to do what we can to help everyone - fans, guests, staff, dealers, and everyone else - enjoy Worldcon and our host city.

Montreal-Trudeau International Airport

• What is the most practical and convenient way on public transit from your airport(s) to your main hotel?

A public bus service called the **747** is available 24 hours a day, 7 days a week. The bus provides a direct line between the airport and downtown Montréal, where it stops at a handful of metro stations and hotels. The journey time is approximately 25-35 minutes to the Lionel-Groulx metro station and 45-70 minutes to the Berri-UQÀM station, depending on traffic conditions. To catch the bus, head to the arrivals level. Cost for the pass is \$11.

No accessibility issues identified, but will be doing another check at All Staff next June

What are the room rates?

Canadian dollars for 2027 (excluding taxes etc.) range from \$295 to \$325. We're working on one hotel (The Monville) which will be under this range.

Regular suites at the Westin, the Party and HQ Hotel, are under \$390 (King or Queen Suites)

Do these rates include breakfast and internet access?

No for breakfast, yes for internet.

How firm are these rates?

Confirmed in writing through the Convention Bureau

What additional taxes and fees are there?

All rates are subject to applicable taxes: 9.975% provincial, 5% federal (GST), and 3.5% city occupancy tax.

• What is the distance between the main hotel and the main program or exhibits site, if any.

Distance between the Westin and Palais (including taking elevators and escalators) about 5 minutes. Several other hotels are adjacent to the Palais as well.

• Are you in more than one building? Are the buildings connected or adjacent? If not, what transportation is available between sites for members with mobility issues?

A few events will be in the headquarter hotel (The Westin Montreal) which is a minute's walk across the street to the Palais street level lobby.

Where will your main events (Hugo Awards, Masquerade, etc.) be held?

Room 517BCD, 31,774 square feet

What is the seating capacity there?

Capacity 3935 depending on staging and other setup requirements

 Where can on-site socializing happen? Are arrangements required to permit serving food or alcohol? The main social space is at the Westin's main restaurant and bar. Seating is for 100.

We are exempt from corkage in the Westin, the main Party Hotel. We have to pay corkage in function space at the Palais and the Westin and would be covered under their licensing. We do not have to get food handling licensing for party rooms and suites, but we do have to get an overall liquor permit for any parties serving alcohol in party rooms and suites. We likely will obtain permits like we did in 2009 - we had permits obtained by the convention for floors with such parties.

• What are the rules and laws regarding smoking? Where is smoking permitted on site (and what can be smoked)?

The law in Quebec is strict regarding cigarettes and smoking, including tobacco, electronic cigarettes and cannabis. Smoking is not allowed in public places, including the entirety of the PdC Convention Center and any outdoor location within 9m of a public entrance. Some hotels offer rooms where smoking is permitted. Smoking is permitted in outdoor spaces that are not near public entrances and in licensed cigar lounges. The closest lounges are about 2 km from the convention center.

• What will your policies be regarding public health and disease transmission?

We will follow the current guidance from the health authorities of Canada and Quebec. Anyone's choices to add additional precautions, such as wearing a mask if one is not required, will be respected.

What are the parking rates for your convention center and hotel(s)?

Parking rate at the Palais is \$25 Canadian per day and is open 24 hours a day. Most hotels have valet parking owned by third parties and average about \$50 per day and recommend guests use the Palais.
